PROCLAMATION THANKING FIREFIGHTERS AND FIRST RESPONDERS FOR THEIR EFFORTS IN RESPONDING TO THE MARCH 2, 2024, BRUSHFIRE

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2024, a dangerous brushfire broke out south of the City of Las Animas; and

WHEREAS, the fire was fast moving and at its peak grew to nearly two square miles;

and

WHEREAS, the fire threatened both the City of Las Animas and the surrounding residents and property in Bent County; and
